Robin and Wren class have been busy writing their letters to Santa. They have been looking through the Argos book for ideas and using their sounds to write what they would like. They thought we were just posting them in the post box but they were in for a big surprise! We had a helicopter bring Santa's elves to collect their letters. An experience they will never forget. After their visit we then spent a day making helicopters from junk modelling, dressing up as pilots and deciding where we would fly.

They have also been working extremely hard practising their songs and lines for their Christmas play. Pictures of the children in their outfits will be on tapestry for you to see. We hope you enjoyed it!

The children in Key Stage 1 have had an exciting half term. They have been enthusiastic and motivated whilst continuing their learning journey into our topic 'What lights up our World?' Firstly, they further developed their knowledge of the Gun Powder Plot and created shape poems using onomatopoeia and adjectives. This was followed by innovating the text 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark". The children either produced their own version of the story or wrote a new chapter. In mathematics the children have been further developing their knowledge and skills with the area of addition and subtraction.

Our children have become little scientists this half term and conducted several experiments demonstrating a progression of skills whilst working scientifically. These experiments included discussions and experiments linked to our 'Big Questions': Why do leaves change colour in Autumn? How does a bulb light up? and 'What would happen if a snowman wore a coat? The children found it fascinating testing their predictions and recording their results.

Jorgie said 'I thought the snowman would melt faster wearing a coat but the coat was an insulator and stopped the warm air getting to it, so it melted slower!'

The children have been looking at ways to help our school become more Eco-Friendly and they were all inspired during our Geography Week when Gary from Carymoor delivered workshops on the 3R's, Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.







We were also extremely lucky to have staff from Carymoor return to Pen Mill to run our Christmas Craft workshops. Children either made stunning Christmas trees from reused paper or made their own Christmas paper from recycling old paper. The children especially enjoyed learning that you can make paper from recycled Elephants Poo!
