

# EYFS - Cygnet Class - Big Question?


## What has Cygnet Class been up to this half term?

This half term we have been exploring dinosaurs and helping the dinosaur to find his roar! We made dinosaurs out of playdough, using pasta and sticks and we have been measuring how long and short our dinosaur toys are. # What has Wren Class been doing this half term?
