

Supporting Children and Young People with ADHD - Training

What

This **FREE** two-hour training will look at ADHD, what it is (and what it isn't), explore differences (neurodiversity), and offer practical strategies and guidance to support children and young people with ADHD. It also aims to facilitate dialogue between those attending in the hope of further community support and help.

Who

For SENCOs, Parents/carers (of children and young people with diagnoses of ADHD), PFSAs, FIS Workers, School Nurses, CAOT and A&C Advisory teachers.

The training will be delivered to every pyramid of schools in Somerset as well as special schools and partnership schools. Additional sessions will be available for the independent sector.

The training will be delivered by Educational Psychologists and Assistant Educational Psychologists.

When

Schools will be notified of the date their pyramid of schools are able to attend the training. All sessions (except a few) are running on Thursday afternoons (1.30-3.30pm) from January until July 2022.

There will be additional follow up sessions at a later date.

How

For the time being this training will be virtual through Microsoft Teams.

As well as SENCOs we would like schools to invite parents/carers of children in their school who have a diagnosis of ADHD, their PFSAs and their school nurses.
